Your child should read every day if possible. Can you remember all of the food that was eaten, in the correct order?<br/>You might want to add some actions when re-telling the story here are some suggestions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Hungry and stomach ache – rub tummy.</li><li>• Caterpillar – wriggle arms to look like a caterpillar</li><li>• For numbers hold up the right number of fingers.</li><li>• Moon and sun – Make a large circle in the air with your hands.</li><li>• Ate – pretend to bite into something.</li><li>• Butterfly flap arms like you are flying.</li></ul> <p>Create your own puppet show where you perform the story to your family.<br/>You may like to watch a short animated version of the story <a href="#">The Very Hungry Caterpillar Animation</a></p> <p>-</p> |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Use Spelling Shed to practise your common exception words and other lists set for you.</li><li>- <b>SPELLING SHED ACTIVITIES ARE ON FOR THIS WEEK – <a href="#">PLEASE LOG IN</a></b></li><li>- Practise recalling your sounds and blending words using:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- <a href="#">Phonics play</a></li><li>- <a href="#">Phonics Bloom</a></li><li>- <a href="#">Spell the days of the week</a></li></ul></li></ul>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Make a list of the foods the Hungry caterpillar ate during the story; can you sort them into healthy and unhealthy foods.<br/><i>Extra challenge</i> - Make a list of your favourite foods, which would you eat first? which would you leave until last?</li><li>- Practise writing and spelling the days of the week correctly. 

- *Extra challenge – Can you keep a diary for the week? Write the names of the days of the week and under each day write what you did on this day.e.g. I played with my toys, played in the garden, made some cakes etc.*
- Complete a story map for the story.
- Can you write a similar story about a 'very hungry' animal? What happens to it? (This can be done over 2 days)

*Parents - If your child is really struggling to write you could write down their ideas for them. Your child could then draw pictures for each part of their story.*


Read the non-fiction story of **Caterpillar to Butterfly** on [www.getepic.com/students](http://www.getepic.com/students)
